POSTGRADUATE STUDIES IN THEOLOGY AT ST AUGUSTINE

St Augustine offers three postgraduate degrees in Theology: the BTh (Hons), the MPhil (Theology), and the DPhil (Theology). The degrees would be of potential interest to priests, ministers, religious persons, teachers, coordinators of parish catechetics, youth leaders, lay persons involved in pastoral work, or those who simply want to deepen their understanding of the Christian faith. More specifically, the MPhil specialisation in Canon Law would be of obvious relevance to those wanting to work in Church tribunals.

While working out of the Catholic Tradition, our faculty members are ecumenically open and contextually sensitive. Many of our guest lecturers represent other Christian confessions. Our programmes attempt to balance faith and reason, engaging the two major sources for theologising: Scripture-in-Tradition and human experience.

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY (HONOURS)

Students are required to complete four modules: a compulsory module in Theological Method, and three additional modules that follow either the Systematic or Pastoral Tracks. Apart from attending four teachings weeks during the postgraduate lecture sessions of the academic year (one per quarter), students are required to complete formative and summative assessment tasks. In addition, all students are obliged to complete a 10 000 word Research Project on an approved topic.

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY IN THEOLOGY

Students are required to complete seven or eight modules in one of three specialisations: Fundamental and Systematic Theology, Christian Spirituality, and, Canon Law. Apart from attending four teachings weeks during the postgraduate lecture sessions of the academic year (one per quarter), students are required to complete formative and summative assessment tasks. In addition, all students are obliged to complete an 18 000 word Research Paper on an approved topic.
